ACCEPTABLE MATERIAL GUIDELINES

PAPER



Cardboard & Paper Bags

Flatten cardboard & cut into pieces



Junk Mail

Envelopes, flyers, brochures, postcards etc.



Paperboard

No wax coated paperboard



Newspaper

Remove bags, strings and rubber bands



Magazines & Catalogs

All types & sizes



Office Paper

All types and sizes



Phone Books

All types and sizes

GLASS



*Clear Glass

Empty Clear Glass Only

METAL



*Steel & Tin Cans

Empty cans only



*Aluminum Cans

Empty cans only



Kitchen Cookware

Metal pots, pans, tins & utensils

PLASTIC



*Plastic Jugs/Bottles

(#1 & #2)



*Household Plastic

(#3 - #7) Empty containers only



*Plastic Bags

Most retail and grocery bags

RECYCLING BIN FULL?

- Paper Milk or Juice Cartons (Wax Coated)
- Styrofoam Containers/Packing
- Garbage
- Compost Food Waste
- Propane Tanks
- Paint Cans
- Medical Waste* (Syringes/Needles)
- Batteries
- Flammable Liquids
- Household Cleaners
- Chemicals (Dry or Liquid)
- Wood Items
- Concrete
- Garden Hose/Rubber
- Electrical Cords
- Tires

IS YOUR RECYCLING BIN FULL? DON'T STOP RECYCLING!

Here are some ideas for you to achieve this goal:

- Call your city and ask for extra bins
- Put the extra Recyclables in a clear bag next to your recycle bin.
- Make your own bin* from an old receptacle of some sort (cardboard box or garbage can)
- Be sure to mark on the outside of the bin "Recyclables"

Visit www.in-the-bin.com to print your own labels and apply to your alternate recycling bin.

**Check with your local recycling hauler to make sure they will accept the new bin & weight restrictions.*
